Why are we switching to Google?

environment



What is meant by a switch to Google? Are we keeping any of the Microsoft?

- Switch ONLY includes retiring our current Microsoft Exchange email server and solely using Google for email
- Outlook email client will no longer be supported as the official district email client.
- After the switch users can simply use any browser to access their emails going forward.
- The District will still continue to use all other Microsoft products including Microsoft Office.

District uses both Exchange/Outlook and Google

New Direction

Retire Exchange server and move all accounts to Google. Switch Google to BHUSD.ORG



How are you addressing student safety & privacy?

IT has confirmed that Google for Education adheres to student privacy and safety laws such as CIPA, COPPA, FERPA, SOPIPA



Is there a cost benefit to this migration?

- There is a cost to migrate the district to Google. The cost is estimated to be between \$7,000 - \$15,000.
- The operational cost of the migration is cost neutral
