**Suggested Changes to 3000 Series Board Policies and Administrative Regulations**

<b>Number</b>	<b>BP/AR</b>	<b>Title</b>	<b>Suggested Changes</b>
<b>3471</b>	<b>BP</b>	<b>Parcel Taxes</b>	(BP NEW) New policy addresses the major requirements of levying, with voter approval, a parcel tax on real property which may be used by the district for any purpose specified in the ballot statement.
<b>3551</b>	<b>BP</b>	<b>Food Service Operations/Cafeteria Fund</b>	(BP revised) Policy updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 265) which provides that students with unpaid meal fees must not be denied a reimbursable meal of their choice, eliminating the possibility that any student is required to receive an alternate meal. Policy also reflects a waiver granted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture extending the three year Administrative Review cycle to a five-year cycle for school years 2017-18 through 2021-22.
<b>3551</b>	<b>AR</b>	<b>Food Service Operations/Cafeteria Fund</b>	(AR revised) Regulation updated to reorganize the section on "Unpaid and Delinquent Meal Charges" to emphasize the prohibition against directing any action toward a student to collect unpaid school meal fees and reflect requirements, as amended by SB 265, to treat students with unpaid meal fees the same as other students.
<b>3555</b>	<b>BP</b>	<b>Nutrition Program Compliance</b>	(BP revised) Policy updated to reflect NEW STATE REGULATIONS (Register 2020, No. 21) which provide that complaints regarding meal counting and claiming, reimbursable meals, eligibility of children or adults, or use of cafeteria funds and allowable expenses should be submitted directly to the California Department of Education (CDE), and complaints alleging discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability should be submitted to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). Complaints regarding other program requirements or other bases for discrimination are to be investigated and resolved at the district level. Policy

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			also deletes the USDA nondiscrimination statement that must be included on all forms of communication regarding program availability, which is now presented in the accompanying exhibit.
3555	E	Nutrition Program Compliance	(Exhibit NEW) New exhibit presents the USDA statement, formerly in BP 3555, which must be included on all forms of communication available to the public regarding the availability of child nutrition programs in order to advise the public of the district's status as an equal opportunity provider and the address of the agency with responsibility to handle complaints against the district.
3600	BP	Consultants	(BP revised) Policy updated to reflect NEW LAW (AB 5) which codifies a three-part test, established in <i>Dynamex Operations West Inc. v. Superior Court of Los Angeles</i> , to determine whether a person providing services for remuneration should be classified as an employee or an independent contractor. Policy also updates the statement on nondiscrimination to include additional protected categories, and reflects law regarding harassment of or by an independent contractor.
