DUAL LANGUAGE IMMERSION TEACHER

(185-Day Certificated Salary Schedule)

DEFINITION:

Under the direction of the site administrator, provide standards-based, culturally embedded instruction in the classroom, which meets district standards and assessments and leads to oral language proficiency and biliteracy in Spanish and English.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBLITIES:

The duties listed below are intended to describe various types of work that may be assigned & performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position.

- Guide the learning process toward the achievement of curriculum goals and—in harmony with the goals establish clear objectives for all lessons, units, projects, and the like, to communicate these objectives to students.
- 2. Plan lessons for daily instruction that derive from state standards, assessments and dual immersion curriculum.
- 3. Assist in the development of curriculum for the dual immersion program.
- 4. Provide educational experiences in the classroom that reflect the philosophy, goals and expectations of the dual immersion program.
- 5. Conduct instruction effectively and proficiently in Spanish and English.
- 6. Structure activities in the classroom to facilitate oral language production and comprehension.
- 7. Use context clues, manipulatives, realia, visuals, and student-centered instruction to facilitate comprehension in the target language.
- 8. Effectively differentiate both content and language learning to ensure that all students successfully meet program assessments and outcomes.
- 9. Assess student progress in a formative manner in oral and written language development, literacy and numeracy; adjust instruction according to assessment results.
- 10. Maintain and improve professional competence by participating in opportunities for professional development.
- 11. Advocate for the high academic achievement and social development of all students.
- 12. Collaborate with peers, administrators, and others, including dual language grade level partners/teams.
- 13. Work effectively with a wide variety of students in a culturally diverse setting.
- 14. Maintain effective working relationships with parents, students and community.
- 15. Create a classroom environment that engages and supports all students in learning and is appropriate to the maturity and interests of students.
- 16. Communicate with parents and school counselors on student progress.
- 17. Engage parents and others as resources to enhance student learning.
- 18. Identify student needs, and cooperate with other professional staff members in helping students solve health, attitude and learning problems.

WORKING CONDITIONS

Environment:

- Classroom and outside work setting
- Subject to frequent interruptions and daily contact with staff, parents, and students

Physical Abilities:

- Hearing and speaking to exchange information and make presentations

- Dexterity of hands and fingers to operate a computer keyboard
