Important Announcement

After the Pledge of Allegiance, Board President, Mrs. Carolyn Wilson stated that Dr. Mucerino would be making an announcement to the Alvord Unified School District's teachers, staff, and community.

Superintendent, Dr. Mucerino stated that due to the current conditions related to the Coronavirus, the Board of Education is exercising its right to delay the physical return to schools. Students will begin school on August 10, 2020, but will do so remotely. Dr. Mucerino will release additional details in a message and Press Release. The Board of Education will reevaluate the situation after Labor Day to determine when it is safe for students and employees to return to school.

9. DISCUSSION/INFORMATION ITEMS

a. Board of Education/Superintendent

1. Ethnic Studies

Minutes:

Trustee Ms. Lizeth Vega stated that she is excited and this is the first time she brings a topic to a Board Meeting for discussion. Ms. Vega also expressed how studying Ethnic Studies in community college changed the perspective on her life and identity. Ms. Vega shared that while she was in community college, the students that studied Ethnic Studies felt more proud of their heritage and motivated to keep going in their education and careers. Ms. Vega stated that she would like to see Ethnic Studies taught throughout the district.

Trustee Mrs. Carolyn Wilson stated that the Board has spoken to Dr. Kemp regarding Ethnic Studies and that it is coming to our District. Mrs. Wilson also stated that she would like to see Ethnic Studies at all of our high schools and middle schools.

Assistant Superintendent, Dr. Sherri Kemp stated that Assembly Bill 331 states that Ethnic Studies will be a graduation requirement by the year 2024. Dr. Kemp also stated that the California Department of Education is creating a model curriculum that honors the four foundational groups: African Americans, Chicano/Latin X, Asian Americans, and Native Americans. Dr. Kemp stated that the curriculum would be released in spring of 2021. Dr. Kemp shared that Norte Vista High School currently has Ethnic Studies and will be offered at Hillcrest High School through AVID classes.

Trustee Dr. Joanna Dorado thanked Trustee Vega for bringing this topic to Board for discussion. Dr. Dorado expressed her support for this initiative. Dr. Dorado shared that Ethnic Studies is a great passion for herself as well.

Trustee Mrs. Julie Moreno applauded Vice President Vega for bringing this topic for discussion. Mrs. Moreno also applauded Ms. Georgina Ramirez for the passion she has for this topic and bringing this curriculum to our students. Trustee Mr. Robert Schwandt expressed his gratitude to Ms. Vega for bringing this topic to Board. Mr. Schwandt stated that we need to support Dr. Kemp in case there are any roadblocks and support her in carrying out this program in our schools.
