Goal One: *Conditions of Learning*



Students will be enrolled in a comprehensive course of study taught by highly qualified teachers.



- 0% of teachers misassigned
- 100% of instructional aides and teachers are highly qualified
- Supportive environments and two-way communication in families' native languages
- Increase of Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) offerings at the secondary schools
 - Middle Schools: 140 sections to 150
 - High Schools: 119 sections to 242

Conditions of Learning: Students will be enrolled in a comprehensive course of study taught by highly qualified teachers.

- Additional hours and supplies to middle school athletics
- Additional professional development on A-G courses
- New position-Director of Secondary Education
- New positions-Assistant Principals at all elementary schools
- New positions-Additional Assistant Principals at all middle Schools
- Interactive flat panels to engage students in learning
- Additional staffing to support Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA)
- Musical instrument replacement at all schools levels
- Increased custodial staff to ensure sanitation

- Expansion of Dual Language Immersion to 7th Grade
- Professional Development specifically designed for ELD
- Increase elementary PE teachers by 3 to provide PE to all TK-5th grade students
- Increase PE Assistants by 3 to provide instruction to all TK-5th grade students
- Research the development of the PUENTE Program at La Sierra and Hillcrest
- Additional staffing for inclusion and co-teaching



CORE SUCCESSES

Goal Three: Student Engagement



Students will be educated in an environment which fosters school connectedness and is inclusive of students, parents, and staff.

- Multiple modes of communication and in multiple languages
- Maintain counselors at all grade spans (elementary middle and high school)
- Ongoing offerings through Expanded Learning opportunities for elementary and middle schools
- Ongoing offerings through summer school and credit recovery
- Family Engagement Coordinator: 35 Webinars; 28 Parent Academies, and CA state presenters at the National Community Schools and Family Engagement Conference
- Maintained a successful Health Clinic to the community
- Mental Health Outreach Coordinator that works with foster youth and families experiencing homelessness



Student Engagement: *Students will be educated in an environment which fosters school connectedness and is inclusive of students parents and staff.*

- Integration of Parent Square for two-way communication
- New hires 14 Registered Behavior Therapists
- Development of middle school Intramural Sports
- Additional funding allocated to campus supervision to increase student safety
- Piloting new curriculum for elementary counselors
- Support for Culturally Relevant student activities
